We are working closely with our waiting list for the coming 12 months and ask that any of you who would like extra sessions or know that you might need to book a place for a younger (or expected) sibling to let us know as soon as possible to avoid disappointment.

Children who are due to claim funding from September will soon bring home forms for completion and you are able to apply upto 6 weeks before your child's 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday at <a href="https://www.childcarechoices.co.uk">www.childcarechoices.co.uk</a>. You are also able to find information regarding Tax Free Childcare on the same website (available to use with all age-groups from babies upto school age children needing wrap around care)

Funding for Summer Term ends on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> July, although some families may have extra funded hours to use in the summer holiday period.

**Drinks in nursery** - please could parents be advised if sending in drinks with your child for the day that water is the only drink permitted in nursery. Not only for dental reasons, but a more serious reason for the safety of other children. Some children in our care have diabetes and to drink a sugary or fruit drink by mistake would make them very ill. Thank you for helping with this matter.



Just to remind you we have exclusion procedures in place to prevent illness spreading further and to protect the children and staff;



Vomiting and/or diarrhoea – your child must remain away from nursery until 48 hours clear of symptoms

Raised temperature – your child's temperature must be normal for 24 hours without the aid of medication

Chickenpox –,we have had recent cases 21<sup>st</sup> April and 1<sup>st</sup> June so the illness is likely to still be 'doing the rounds' at nursery. If your child had symptoms they should stay at home for the first 5 days of the rash at least and when clinically well. Due to children attending nursery with compromised immunity, chickenpox is a severe danger to them – it is essential you let nursery know if your child has symptoms.

**Coughs and colds** – of course children will inevitably come into nursery with coughs and colds, we just ask that they should be well enough to have fun, play indoors and outdoors and happy to eat.



The children loved making friends with the cows, looking at wild flowers, making daisy chains and going down the slide.








This annual programme is designed to promote essential knowledge, skills, experience of everyday occurrences, services and skills needed throughout life.

## Childcare payments and funding

#### Tax Free Childcare

You are able to sign up for this on HMRC website <a href="https://childcare-support.tax.service.gov.uk">https://childcare-support.tax.service.gov.uk</a> our nursery is registered as St. Michael's Nursery and our postcode EX31 2DB. Here you will find out the criteria to be eligible for TFC.

#### 30 hours funded childcare

To be eligible both parents (or on parent for single households) need to be working and both parents must be earning a minimum of equivalent to 16 hours NLW per week and up to under £100,000 per annum (each). Parents on sick pay and maternity/paternity pay are eligible, however students will not be eligible.

How does it work? will have read in recent press articles that the funding received by Local Authorities does not cover the cost per hour of the child attending nursery and therefore nurseries need to consider how they will deliver the funded hours in a sustainable way or choose to opt out of the extra hours. You will be pleased to hear that St. Michael's delivers the extra hours to qualifying parents from this Autumn and the costs of contributions by parents for additional services, not covered by funding, is sent out to families.

Families can choose to 'stretch' the extra hours (as some of you do with your 15 hours) and this would then create up to 22 hours per week across the 51 weeks we are open. You are able to split your funding with other settings. Claiming 30 hours would affect your Tax Credits.

My child is eligible next term, when should I apply? You are able to apply 6 weeks before your child's third birthday at https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk

Families need to reapply every three months, and you should receive a reminder email. Please make a note of your renewal date as in the future a missed renewal will mean you miss your next term's extra funding.

#### What if I don't qualify for 30 hours funding?

15 hours per week remains universal to all 3 & 4 year olds (the term after their third birthday), the 30 hours is an extension of this, offering an extra 15 hours per week.

For children on universal 15 hours funding, you are able to take up to 15 hours per week, term time only, or 'stretch' your hours up to 11 hours per week throughout the year.

Families may also wish to find out form HMRC how Child Tax Credits for <u>Universal Credits</u> would be affected if claiming 30 hours funded childcare. The new <a href="https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk">https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk</a> website is fantastic for helpful information and includes a parents' calculator to help with the choices you make.
